GOAL:

DIRECTIONS:

1. Review each square on the bingo card and, if you have personally experienced a situation, mark the square (for example, highlight it, cross it off, or color the box).
2. Mark as many boxes as you can.
3. You have a bingo when you have five squares marked in a row vertically, horizontally, or diagonally.
4. Be sure to share and discuss your results with colleagues and friends playing with you.
